### METAL

- Aerosol cans (empty, non-hazardous)
- Appliances, small metal (e.g., toaster, blender)
- Cans (e.g., food, beverage, pet food)
- Foil, foil trays, pans
- Furniture
- Hardware (e.g., keys, nails, screws)
- Household items (e.g., pots, pans, trays, utensils)
- Lids, caps
- Lighting fixtures
- Paint cans (empty, dry, no excessive residue)

- Scrap metal (plumbing fixtures, small auto parts)

### PAPER (staples, tape okay)

- Bags (e.g., white, colored, non-metallic)
- Books (e.g., hard/soft cover, telephone)
- Boxes (e.g., cereal, cracker, tissue, shoe, mailing)
- Carbonless (e.g., receipt books, sales forms)
- Cardboard (flatten, unwaxed)
- Catalogs
- Colored, white, glossy
- Egg cartons
- Envelopes (plastic window okay)
- Frozen food packaging
- Junk mail
- Magazines
- Manila folders
- Newspaper (inserts okay)
- Paper ream wrappers
- Photographs (NO Polaroids/instant photos)
- Self-stick notes
- Shredded paper (tie in a clear plastic bag)
- Wrapping, tissue paper (non-metallic)

### GLASS (clear and colored, except blue and red)

- Bottles
- Jars

### FILM PLASTICS (Please place inside a clear plastic bag and knot the top of the bag)

- Bags (e.g., bread, dry clean, grocery, newspaper, produce, merchandise, zip lock)
- Bubble wrap
- Case wrap (e.g., beverage container, snack flats)
- Liners (e.g., cereal box)
- Pallet/shrink wrap
- Plastic packaging wrap (e.g., wrap from toilet paper, napkins, paper towels, diapers)
- Shipping envelopes (labels removed)

### PLASTICS (with or without a number) Note: Expanded Polystyrene aka Styrofoam® is NOT accepted

- Auto parts (small)
- Bottles (e.g., beverage, laundry and household cleaners, personal care products, prescription)
- Baskets
- Buckets
- Cartridges (e.g., toner, ink jet, printer)
- Coolers
- Computer housing
- Crates
- Lids
- Flower pots
- Food containers (e.g., cottage cheese, margarine, yogurt, take-out)
- Pet carriers (hard plastic)
- Pipe (non-PVC)
- Product packaging (e.g., small electronics, razors)
- Shelving
- Toys (e.g., hard plastic pools, play structures)
- Trays

### ELECTRONICS (anything with a computer chip) Note: Televisions and computer monitors NOT accepted

- Appliances (e.g., coffee maker, microwave oven)
- Camera
- Calculator
- Cell phone (inside clear tear-resistant bag)
- Computer (e.g., desk top, lap top)
- Computer mouse, cables
- Home entertainment (e.g., game system, DVR, VCR, stereo, radio)
- Keyboard
- Printer, scanner, fax machine
- Shaver - electric
- Toothbrush - electric
- Tablets, e-readers
- Vacuum cleaner



**COMPOST-** Please place all compostable materials in your green compost container.

Contents cannot exceed weight limit listed on cart, maximum of 200 lbs. All items must fit inside the compost container with the lid closed.

### Not Accepted (place in garbage):

Animal waste, bamboo, cactus, dirt, flax, painted wood, palm, pampas grass, poison oak, sod, stable bedding, yucca

\*Branches must be less than 6 inches in diameter and shorter than 4 feet in length.

\*\*Undecorated, unflocked, remove stands, and decorations. Tree sections must not exceed 4 feet in length.

\*\*\*Must be untreated/unpainted. GreenWaste cannot collect or accept treated wood.

## WASTE REDUCTION/ZERO WASTE- It is the goal of GreenWaste of Palo Alto to help the Palo Alto community reduce the amount of waste that is landfilled!

Palo Alto has a goal of zero waste to landfills by 2030. Zero waste goes beyond recycling by taking a whole systems approach to managing the flow of resources. **Reduce:** When shopping for groceries or other products, please do your part to prevent waste by selecting items that have minimal packaging and bring your own reusable bags.

**Reuse:** A significant portion of garbage in the waste stream is generated by using disposable products that could be replaced with reusable items, integrate reusable items into everyday activities such as using reusable containers when bringing food or drinks to work.

**Donate:** Items that are in good condition and are no longer useful to you may be donated to thrift stores, consignment shops, antiques stores and nonprofit groups. **LANDFILL-** Please place all NON-reusable NON-recyclable, NON-compostable and NON-Hazardous items in your landfill container. Contents cannot exceed weight limit listed on cart, maximum of 200 lbs. All items must fit inside the garbage container with the lid closed.

### MULTI-LAYERED MATERIALS

- Aseptic containers (e.g., juice boxes, soy milk)
- Foil wrapped beverage pouches (e.g., Capri Sun®)
- Polaroid photographs
- Single serve coffee pods (e.g., Keurig®)
- Snack packaging (e.g., chip bags, wrappers)

### PAPER

- Carbon paper
- Padded envelopes
- Newspaper (dirty w/ paint or pet waste)
- Stickers (in sheets or rolls)
- Thermal paper (e.g., fax paper, glossy receipts)
- Tyvek

### GLASS

- Ceramics & Vases
- Cookware- glass (e.g., Pyrex™)
- Dishware & Stemware
- Incandescent & halogen light bulbs
- Mirrors
- Windows

### PLASTIC

- Cellophane
- Disposable razors
- Hoses (e.g., car, garden)
- Rope
- Rubber bands
- Tarps
- Straws
- Toothpaste & Ointment tubes
- Webbing/mesh from lawn furniture

### EXPANDED POLYSTYRENE (Styrofoam®)

### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE- These items CANNOT go into the garbage, recycle or compost containers for collection.

### FOR SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENCES ONLY - Household Hazardous Waste accepted in Clean Up Day Service:

**MOTOR OIL & FILTERS:** Used motor oil must be in a clear one-gallon plastic container with a tight fitting screw-top lid. Used oil filters must be in a sealed clear tear-resistant bag. Set out for collection on your pre-scheduled Clean Up Day service dates only.

**HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES:** Household batteries (e.g., AA, AAA, D, nickel cadmium) will be collected when put inside a sealed clear tear-resistant bag and set out on your pre-scheduled Clean Up Day service dates only. No lithium or lithium-ion batteries allowed.

### OTHER STUFF

**Large Item Collection:** Large items such as sofas, mattresses, tables, computer monitors or televisions can be picked up at your curb as part of the Clean Up Day service.
