COVID-19 UPDATE: CLEAN UP DAYS

COVID-19 has resulted in many donation and reuse organizations closing or restricting the items they accept, including the ones that partner with GreenWaste through the residential Clean Up Day program.

To reflect these changes, the only items currently accepted for reuse in the Clean Up Day program are:

- » Clothing and textiles
- » Books
- » CDs/DVDs (only commercial recordings in original cases and in resale condition; no personal recordings)



Items that are no longer accepted for reuse – such as furniture, kitchenware, and generic household items – may still be set out for pickup. These items will be collected by GreenWaste and delivered to a processing facility instead. About 50-60% of the material such as metal, wood, and plastic will be captured for recycling.

Residents who have items in reusable condition are encouraged to donate them to neighbors through Nextdoor, Freecycle, or other channels. RecycleWhere.org has a list of reuse organizations that may take some of your items. Please contact them for a current list of acceptable donation items.

GREENWASTE HIGHLIGHTS



- COMPOST CHRISTMAS TREES:
 For the four weeks following Christmas day, Christmas trees will be collected curbside
 - » Remove stands, decorations, and lights
 - » Cut trees into 4 ft. pieces
 - » Place trees at the curb next to your green compost cart
 - » Trees must be unflocked

ZERO WASTE & COVID: WASTE REDUCTION AND REUSE DURING THE PANDEMIC

COVID-19 has taken a significant toll on local and global waste reduction efforts.

While residents and businesses have rightly focused on keeping themselves and their customers safe, plastic pollution continues to be a significant environmental issue.

In Palo Alto, an increase in packaging waste, disposable Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), cleaning supplies, and single-use items such as foodware has impacted our community's zero waste efforts.

However, aiming for zero waste while protecting against the spread of COVID-19 is possible and important to help us reach our zero waste goals.







Tips to reduce waste during the pandemic:

- » Reusable shopping bags: wash them frequently, keep them in your cart/basket, bag your own groceries.
- » Ordering takeout/delivery: when ordering, request no cutlery, plates, napkins, condiments, etc.
- » Sanitize with reusable cloths. Avoid disposable wipes!
- Buy dry kitchen staples like grains, beans, and spices
 in bulk via online stores such as the Wally Shop.
- » Reduce food waste by trying storage tips from www.savethefood.com/storage to keep food fresh.
- » Opt for reusable masks unless medically necessary: clean them after each day of use.
- » Spruce up your self-care routine: use reusable cotton pads, face wipes, and cotton swabs. Try bamboo toothbrushes and metal razors.
- » When ordering products online, try to place one larger order instead of several small orders to reduce packaging waste.
- » Purchase concentrated/waterless cleaning products.

- » Plan meal portions: try the Guestimator at www.savethefood.com.
- » Use cloth napkins and reusable dinnerware.
- » Save or repurpose your leftovers: the freezer is your friend!
- » Use reusable or compostable decorations such as pinecones, real foliage, and fruits.
- » In general, the fancier the wrapping paper, the less recyclable it is. Instead, try alternative gift-wrapping: cloth, newspaper, reusable bags.
- » Zero waste gift ideas: classes, park passes, self-care gift cards, dinner out at a restaurant, subscriptions for refillable products.
